tourist walking and driving trail in and around Tailem Bend. It's been an interesting journey discovering all the hidden gems in the region.

The Multiple Sclerosis Society of SA & NT hosted an information forum for health professionals, clients and the community which was enjoyed by all.

TBCC was delighted to work with Don Wood and the Tailem Bend Lions club applying and gaining a grant for the IT equipment upgrade for the Town Hall which was thoroughly enjoyed on Melbourne Cup day.

Bizboost helped us overhaul and construct a new website, www.tbcc.org.au hosting a wealth of TBCC information.

The HACC Town Tours to the Meningie Cheese Factory Museum and restaurant, Tailem info Station (TiS), a The Big Olive and Motorsport Park were magnificent, our beautiful district has many hidden gems to offer.

A huge moment was being advised that TBCC was accepted as a community partner with ac.care's Communities for Children Murraylands programme, funded by the Australian Government Department of Social Services. The Caring Community Project enabled us to employ Rebekah Crisp (C4C Project Officer) and will provide local children with access to after school homework programs, arts and crafts, dance and movement activities. Christmas holiday activities for the December/January school holidays, including a mini Deb Ball, cooking and craft classes, excursions and a Mad Hatters tea party, to name a few.

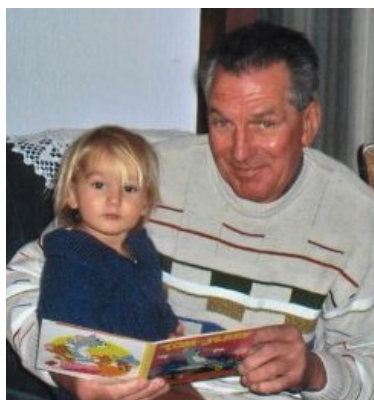
